Gales 3rd of 8 at Upper Arlington

Friday's Larkin Crosten Classic featured a match-up of three of the top boys track and field teams in the Central Ohio Region. In the end, it was Pickerington North who prevailed with 107pts, besting Dublin Coffman with 102.5pts and Lancaster at 89.5pts. But, the Gales suffered a more significant loss when Senior Nolan Flowers was injured in the finals of the 110 High Hurdles. Flowers, also a key runner in the Gales sprint relays, entered the finals with the second fastest qualifying time from the 110HH semis and is one of the top 110 Hurdlers in the region. The extent of his injury will be evaluated further in the next few days.

Other news from the meet was much more positive with several Gales posting outstanding performances. Brannon Kidder won the 1600M in 4:12.37 and the 800M in 1:53.73. Both times were personal bests and both times are the fastest in Ohio for 2011 Season. Scott Watts was strong and reliable, winning the 400M (52.33), taking 6th in the 200M and running strong legs on the Gales scoring 800M and 1600M Relays. Eli Schmelzer was consistent in winning the Pole Vault at 14'0", with teammate Eron Knece taking a solid 3rd. Kyle Trout took 2nd in the Discus with a personal best performance of 148'8"; Kevin Miller was 2nd in the shot put at 48'6.5". Andrew Shisler was 3rd in the 100M at 11.29, just 0.04 seconds off his personal best time of 11.25 set in the semi-finals.

Other top individual performers for the Gales included; Kellen Harris - 4th in the High Jump and 6th in the 400M, Jared Wentz - 5th in the 1600M, Ethan Cordle - 6th in the 300IH and Derek Edwards - 6th(tied) in the High Jump.

The Gales 3200M Relay team of Nathan Wise, Curtis Ewing, Patrick Sabol and Patrick Hinson placed 4th with three of four runners setting new personal bests. Shisler, Connor Smith and Allen Evans joined Watts for a 6th place finish in the 800M Relay; Shisler and Smith, combined with Ethan Cordle and Brandon Meadows to take 6th in the 400M Relay. Watts, Evans, Harris and Kidder took 4th in the 1600M Relay to close out the meet.

Gales 2nd at Mingo Relays

The Lancaster Boys Track & Field Team finished 2nd in the 16 team field at Friday's Mingo Relays at Logan High School. Westerville Central took 1st with 142 points, followed by Lancaster with 132.5 points and Logan with 109 points.

Several Gales posted strong performances in a marathon event which concluded after

midnight. Brannon Kidder won the 1600M (4:19.53), the 800M (1:56.17) and anchored the Gales winning 1600M Relay (3:30.72). Cameron Heimberger, Kellen Harris and Scott Watts also ran strong legs on the Gales 1600M Relay. In other Track Relays; Heimberger, Andrew Bireley, Watts and Kidder took 2nd in the 3200M Relay (8:29.34). Andrew Shisler, Connor Smith, Nolan Flowers and Allen Evans took 5th in the 800M Relay (1:34.63); then Shisler, Smith and Flowers teamed with Ethan Cordle to place 2nd in the 400M Relay (44.33). Patrick Hinson, Nathan Wise, Curtis Ewing and Jared Wentz finished 2nd in the 6400M Relay (19:44.54) and later, Hinson, Evans, Bireley and Wentz teamed up to finish 4th in the Distance Medley Relay (11:27.00).

Individually, Flowers finished 2nd in the 110 High Hurdles (15.27); Watts (23.28) was 5th and Shisler (23.49) was 7th in the 200M; Shisler was also 6th in the 100M (11.36). Watts (51.90) was 3rd and Harris (52.07) was 4th in the 400M. Heimberger was 5th in the 800M (2:07.89) and Wentz was 6th in the 1600M (4:37.55).

Field events were scored individually and as relays with up to 34 points available in each event. Eli Schmelzer (13'6"), Eron Knece (12'6") and Cody Cook (11'0") combined to win the Pole Vault relay, with all three Gales also placing in the individual scoring to earn a meet high total of 25 points. In the Shot Put, Kevin Miller, David Hartranft and Alex Plescher combined to finish 2nd in the Relay, with Miller (50'4") and Hartranft (45'5") finishing 2nd and 7th as individuals. Hartranft, Kyle Trout and Jon Fetherolf also took 2nd in the Discus Relay, with Trout (129'3") take an individual 7th. Kellen Harris was the 3rd individual finisher in the High Jump.

The Varsity Gales compete next in the Larkin-Crosten Classic at Upper Arlington on Friday.

Gales 3rd at Dublin Coffman

The Lancaster Boys Track & Field Team finished 3rd in the 16 team field at Saturday's Dublin Coffman Classic. Host school Dublin Coffman took the team Championship with 102 points, followed by Brunswick with 96 and Lancaster with 91. With this results, the Gales have now defeated 41 of 43 teams faced in the 2011 Outdoor Season.

The Gales started the day by winning the Distance Medley Relay in a meet record time of 10:29.82. The effort by Jared Wentz, Cameron Heimberger, Scott Watts and Brannon Kidder is the fastest in the State so far in 2011 and the 3rd fastest time in Lancaster High School history.

Individual 1st place winners for the Gales were Nolan Flowers in the 110 High Hurdles (15.61), Brannon Kidder in the 1600M (4:29.92) and the 800M (1:57.68) and Eli Schmelzer in the Pole Vault (13'6"). Other medalists for Gales included Kevin Miller - 3rd on the Shot Put at 50'5" and Andrew Shisler - 3rd in the 100M in 11.71.

Other scoring performances for the Gales included; Eron Knece - 4th in the Pole Vault, Jared Wentz - 4th in the 1600M, Scott Watts - 5th in the 400M and Ethan Cordle - 7th in the 300 Intermediate Hurdles. The 1600M Relay of Watts, Flowers, Kidder and Kellen Harris took 4th; the 800M Relay of Harris, Connor Smith, Flowers and Watts took 6th, as did the 400M Relay of Cordle, Shisler, Smith and Flowers; the Gales 3200M Relay team of Heimberger, Curtis Ewing, Nathan Wise and Andrew Bireley took 7th.

Gales Undefeated Streak on the Line

The Lancaster Boys Track & Field Team has won each of its contests so far in 2011, defeating 28 other teams in the process. Most recently, the Gales defeated OCC rival Reynoldsburg 91 - 33 at Fulton Field on Tuesday, with seven Lancaster athletes setting new personal bests.

But, remaining undefeated will be difficult as Lancaster enters Spring Break week with key athletes unavailable due to travel, illness and a few minor injuries. The Gales compete Saturday in a strong field at the Dublin Coffman Classic, then return to Fulton Field to face Pickerington North on Tuesday and host the 45th edition of the Fulton Relays on Thursday. Team depth will be critical as the Gales face 25 opponents over the next seven days, including top-flight squads from Dublin Coffman, Hilliard Davidson, Bradley and Darby, Pick North, Watkins Memorial, Westerville North and New Albany.

Golden Gales Win Stingel Invitational

The Lancaster Boys Track & Field team totaled 106 pts to defeat 15 teams at the Pickerington North – Stingel Invitational. The host school totaled 98pts to finish 2nd, followed by Pickerington Central with 68.5pts and Thomas Worthington at 60pts. Westerville completed the top 5 with 59 pts. Team depth and balanced scoring were key factors for the Gales who, like most teams, had several athletes taking the ACT into the early afternoon.

In the Field Events; Eli Schmelzer placed 1st in the Pole Vault at 14'0'', Kevin Miller was 2nd in the Shot Put with a best throw of 50' 3.25'', Kyle Trout was 2nd in the Discus at 148' 6'' and Kellen Harris was 4th in High Jump at 6' 0''.

On the Track, Nolan Flowers took 1st in the 110 High Hurdles in 15.18 and Andrew Shisler was 3rd in the 100M in 11.41. Brannon Kidder was a double winner, taking first in the 1600M (4:28.35) and the 800M (1:59.12). Patrick Hinson was 3rd in the 3200M (10:13.81). Jared Wentz was 4th in the 3200M (10:16.87) and 6th in the 1600M (4:37.15). Nathan Wise, Allen Evans, Scott Watts and Adam Wise teamed up to take 1st in the Distance Medley. Andrew Shisler, Connor Smith, Nolan Flowers and Brannon Kidder finished 3rd in the 4x100M Relay. Watts and Kidder teamed with Cameron Heimberger and Andrew Bireley to finish 4th in the 4x400M. The Golden Gales completed a successful indoor track & field season by finishing 8th at Saturday's State Championship Meet. The Gales set two new indoor school records, two freshman indoor records and seven personal bests as part of an outstanding overall effort. Scott Watts, Jared Wentz, Cameron Heimberger and Brannon Kidder teamed up to successfully defend Lancaster's 2010 State 4x800M Relay Championship. The Gales ran a season best time of 7:58.45 to narrowly defeat the runners-up from Cleveland St. Ignatius and local rival, Westerville North.

Meanwhile, Lancaster's field event athletes also competed well. Freshman Isaiah Dexter extended his personal best in the Weight Throw by more than 5 feet to finish 7th and earn valuable points for the Gales. Dexter's throw of 59' 3" is a new Lancaster Freshman record and places him at #2 the Gales all-time performance list for the Weight Throw. David Hartranft also set a new personal best to finish in 10th place and is the 4th all-time Gales performer in the Weight Throw. Eli Schmelzer tied for 9th in the Pole Vault and Kevin Miller was 13th in the Shot Put.

Kidder returned to track to win the State 800M Championship in an indoor school record time of 1:54.04 and finishes the indoor season as the top ranked 800M and 1600M runner in Ohio Division I. Adam Wise ran a Lancaster Freshman Record time of 9:40.91 to finish 10th in the 3200M run. The tired foursome of Wentz, Heimberger, Watts and Kidder closed the meet by finishing 13th in the 4x400M Relay.

Lancaster Shares Central District Indoor Crown

The Golden Gales successfully completed their first team test of the 2011 season, tying with Sunbury Big Walnut for the Central District Indoor Championship. The Gales earned their 114 points by dominating the distance and throws events while Big Walnut scored big in the sprints and jumps. Coincidently, the two teams were also tied at the completion of Friday's Field Event portion of the meet.

On Friday, Isaiah Dexter and David Hartranft finished 1-2 in the Weight Throw, Hartranft's throw of 50'6" was a personal best and moved him to a qualifying position (along with Dexter) for the Indoor State Championship. Kevin Miller and Alex Plescher combined to take 1st and 8th place points in the Shot Put; Miller's toss of 48'7" was a new personal best and currently positions him as the first alternate for the State Indoor Shot Put. Eli Schmelzer - 3rd in the Pole Vault, Kellen Harris – 4th in the High Jump and Derek Edwards – 7th in the High Jump also scored valuable points for the Gales on Friday night.

The Golden Gales 4x800M Relay team of Scott Watts, Jared Wentz, Cameron Heimberger and Brannon Kidder opened the Saturday session by winning in a season best time of 8:15.94. Kidder and Adam Wise later combined to finish 1-2 in the Mile Run – Wise's time of 4:37.90 was a personal best. Heimberger then returned to the track to finish 2nd in the 800M run, with Wentz taking 5th. Adam Wise returned to take 2nd in the 3200M Run, with brother Nathan finishing strong to take a 5th. Nolan Flowers was 4th in the 60M Hurdles. Andrew Shisler ran a personal best 7.21 seconds in the 60M Dash to finish 5th. Kellen Harris took 8th in the 400M, just 0.01 second ahead of teammate Ethan Cordle – both ran personal best times. Patrick Wagner closed his indoor season with a personal best time in the 60M Hurdles.

The Gales 4x200M Relay team of Cordle, Brandon Meadows, Flowers and Watts ran a season best time to finish 4th. The tired foursome of Watts, Meadows, Heimberger and Kidder combined to take 4th in the 4x400M Relay and secure enough points for the tie.

Qualifying for the State Indoor Championship closes with Sunday's meets at Oberlin and Geneva. Pending completion of these events, the following Golden Gales athletes have qualified for the State meet:

Brandon Kidder – 1600M (1st), 800M (1st), Eli Schmelzer – Pole Vault (7th), Adam Wise – 3200M (10th), Isaiah Dexter – Weight Throw (12th), David Hartranft – Weight Throw (13th), and the Gales 4x400M Relay (6th) and 4x800M Relay (3rd). Kevin Miller is the first alternate in the Shot Put and will compete in the State Championship if any of the top 16 cannot participate. Kellen Harris (High Jump), Adam Wise (1600M) and Scott Watts (800M) have also posted top 25 marks and are alternates to the State Indoor Championship.

Golden Gales athletes perform well at OSU and Kent State The Golden Gales Track & Field Team competed this weekend in the Arnold Classic Indoor at Ohio State and in a State "qualifier" at Kent State. At Ohio State, Nolan Flowers improved his personal best in the 60M High Hurdles to 8.64 seconds, while Patrick Wagner equaled his best indoor hurdle time. Ethan Cordle and Kellen Harris both ran personal bests in the 200M Dash. Harris also equaled his previous best of 6' 0" in the High Jump, while Cordle posted the best Golden Gales mark of the 2011 indoor season in the Long Jump. Derek Edwards ran a personal best in the 400M and equaled his previous best marks in the Long Jump and High Jump. Nathan Wise set personal records for 800M as part of the Gales 4x800M team, and in the 3200M Run. Spencer Gilmore set a new personal best in the 3200M. Kevin Miller lengthened his previous indoor best in the Shot Put by almost 5 feet, to 48' 1.5" as Alex Plescher set a new personal record of 43' 11.25", also in the Shot Put. Isaiah Dexter improved his best in the Weight Throw to 53' 8" and remains in position to qualify for the State Indoor Championship. David Hartranft set a new personal record in the Weight Throw and is now only 5 spots out of a qualifying position.

At Kent, Scott Watts started the Gales day with a personal best of 2:03.40 to finish 11th in the 800M. Adam Wise ran personal best of 9:45.18 to finish 6th in a strong 3200M field. Adam now ranks 10th in the qualifying for the Indoor State Meet in the 3200M and is the top freshman. Also in the 3200M; Pat Hinson ran 10:00.13 to shatter his previous personal record and finish 11th. The 4x400M Relay team of Watts, Isak Holt, Cameron Heimberger and Brannon Kidder ran a season best time of 3:31.67 to finish 4th at Kent and improve to 5th in the Division 1 State Rankings.

The Golden Gales competed in the University of Kentucky Invitational and the OSU Buckeye Qualifier this weekend. At UK, Brannon Kidder finished 2nd in the Elite Mile which featured top runners from 11 states. Brannon's time of 4:15.72 is the fastest by an Ohio runner for the 2011 Indoor season and currently ranks as the 10th fastest time in the U.S. Kidder also has the Fastest 800M time in the State for 2011. The team of Scott Watts, Isak Holt, Adam Wise and Kidder ran a season best time to finish 7th in the 4x800M Relay. The Gales 4x800M team is currently ranks 6th in the State as it prepares to defend its 2010 Indoor State Championship. Nolan Flowers was also invited to compete at UK and performed well against top competition in the 60M Hurdles.

The Gales competing at OSU also competed well. Isaiah Dexter finished 3rd in the Weight Throw, improving his personal best to 53' 1". Dexter is currently ranked 14th in the State for the Weight Throw; the top 16 athletes in each event are automatic qualifiers to the Indoor State Meet. Eli Schmelzer finished 6th in the Pole Vault and is currently ranked 9th in the State. Kellen Harris finished 7th in the High Jump (T-15th in the State) and 9th in the Long Jump. The Gales 4x200M Relay Team of Jared Thompson, Derek Edwards, Colton Schooley and Ethan Cordle placed 5th. The 4x400M Relay Team of Kellen Harris, Michael Denney, Pat Sabol and Stephen Sparks finish in 7th.

Several other Gales continue to work toward qualifying for the Indoor State Meet. Other Top 20 individual finishes included Kellen Harris - 11th in the High Jump; Nolan Flowers - 14th in 60M High Hurdles; Patrick Hinson - 14th in the 3200M; David Hartranft – 14th in the Weight Throw; Derek Edwards – 15th in the High Jump; and Scott Watts – 16th in the 400M Dash. The Gales 4x800M Relay team of Watts, Wise, Isak Holt and Kidder finished 2nd, holding on to the #7 spot in the Division I State Rankings.

The Indoor Gales compete next at the OSU French Field House on February 12th.

The Golden Gales competed Saturday against teams from four states in the Pioneer Elite Indoor Track Invitational at Marietta College. No team scores were recorded, but the Gales posted several notable results. David Hartranft was 3rd in the Shot and the Weight Throw. Kellen Harris equaled his personal best of 6'0" in the high jump and finished 3rd. Nolan Flowers finished 5th in the 55M high hurdles. Adam Wise set a personal best while finishing 6th in the Mile and Patrick Hinson was 7th in the 5000M, setting a new school record in this seldom run indoor event.

The 4x1600M team of Hinson, Patrick Sabol, Curtis Ewing and Nathan Wise finished 4th.

Sabol, Ewing and Wise all ran indoor personal best splits.

The team of Cameron Heimberger, Isak Holt, Scott Watts and Brannon Kidder won the 4x800M, and is currently ranked 6th among teams qualifying for the Ohio Indoor State Championship.

The Gales Distance Medley Relay of Adam Wise, Watts, Heimberger and Kidder finished 2nd, while running the fastest time of the indoor season by an Ohio team.

The Sprint Medley team of Ethan Cordle, Brandon Meadow, Derek Edwards and Isak Holt concluded the day's competition for the Gales with a 4th place finish.
